ALL **BUSINESSES** CAN HELP TO REDUCE **ROUGH SLEEPING IN THE CITY CENTRE, HERE'S HOW**

Peterborough Positive is supporting the Safer Off the Streets partnership. Safer Off the Streets is a registered Peterborough charity that aims to encourage rough sleepers to leave the streets for good and engage with the organisations trying to help them.

The partnership is formed of voluntary, faith, community and public organisations in Peterborough. It raises funds to keep the Garden House open, which is a day shelter started by The Light Project.

The Garden House is located in the cathedral grounds and is a hub for partnership working. It offers rough sleepers a friendly face, a cup of hot tea or coffee and offers services such as access to Housing Needs, training, employment, GP Services, chiropody, art classes and drug and alcohol support. It is staffed by volunteers who work with partner agencies.

Shockingly, the average life expectancy of a rough sleeper is just 47. Peterborough business can help by:

WOULD YOUR BUSINESS BENEFIT FROM A WORKPLACE FIRE SAFETY SESSION?

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service is offering free fire safety sessions for businesses to help them understand their responsibilities for relevant fire safety legislation.

The sessions will be presented by qualified Fire Safety Officers either face-to-face at a local fire station or remotely via Microsoft Teams. If similar business types apply, bespoke presentations will take place to concentrate on what is specific to them. Each session begins at 9am, lasts around 90 minutes and there will be opportunities to ask questions throughout. We encourage our BID levy payers to book on to one these sessions, which will provide a better appreciation of the Fire Safety Order, the need for assessment of fire risk and the application of fire safety measures within the city centre.
