TRUE PICTURE OF CRIME

Almost 500 incidents have been logged onto the Peterborough Business Crime Partnership (Disc) since we launched the scheme to businesses in November - and we encourage you to continue to help us build a true picture of crime in our city centre.

Membership is currently at 150 businesses and we can't emphasise enough how crucial it is to regularly log-in, view galleries, identify unknown offenders and view all the current news and alerts.

It's also very important that you continue to submit incidents of business crime to the partnership system. Disc allows you to legally and GDPR compliantly share information with our members of offenders' images.

So far, Peterborough Business Crime Partnership statistics read:

- > Member logins: 6,492
- > Incidents received: 495
- > Total losses reported: £31,175
- > Total losses recovered: £17,877
- > Known offenders: 266
- > Unknown offenders: 150

There is a lack of reporting of business crime throughout the UK and we can buck this trend by increasing membership to the Peterborough Business Crime Partnership.
