

Peterborough city centre businesses now have the ability to ban individuals from their premises with the new exclusion scheme from Peterborough Business Crime Partnership (Disc).

Members of our free crime reporting system can formally exclude offenders for 12 months through the new scheme which launched on 5th September, to help deter and displace business crime and antisocial behaviour from the city centre.

The Peterborough Business Crime Partnership operates for all member businesses, meaning any exclusion orders will formally exclude offenders from all member premises from the day of the offence – simply put, banned from one, banned from ALL.

If you're a member of Disc and aren't already displaying a branded Disc/Peterborough Positive window sticker, we suggest sticking one in a visible spot at the front of your building to make it clear to any banned offenders that they cannot enter your premises as part of their 12-month exclusion.

BEWARE OF **NEW REMOTE ACCESS SCAMS**

Action Fraud has received 31 crime reports since June 2023 regarding **remote access scams targeting businesses**, with victims reporting losses totalling over £3.8m.

Although some businesses have reported varying accounts of how the scam was executed, the general aim of the scam is to convince victims to log in to their online banking account whilst the scammer has remote access to their computer via a piece of software they convinced them to install.

Protect your business from remote access scams:

- Your bank will never ask you
 to grant them remote access
 to your computer or
 smartphone. Never install any
 remote access software on
 your device as a result of an
 unsolicited call, browser
 pop-up, or text message.
- The one-time verification codes sent to you by your bank to authorise transactions on your account should never be shared with anyone, not even bank employees.

- If you believe your laptop, PC, tablet or phone has been infected with a virus or some other type of malware, follow the National Cyber Security Centre's guidance on recovering an infected device –

- Received a suspicious call from someone claiming to be from your bank? Hang up, wait a few minutes, then call your bank using the contact number on the back of your debit card, or use the contact information on their official website or app.
